


FAMILIES NEED TO MAKE AT LEAST **\$76,000 PER YEAR** TO OWN A MEDIAN VALUE HOME IN BELLINGHAM

7% OF BELLINGHAM HOUSEHOLDS **MAKE LESS THAN THAT**

LACK OF AFFORDABLE HOUSING MAKES IT DIFFICULT FOR EMPLOYERS TO RECRUIT WORKERS AT ALL LEVELS



2000 TO 2016 INCREASES IN BELLINGHAM:






 Wages haven't increased relative to housing costs
