Affordable Childcare

Working Connections Child Care (WCCC) helps families with low incomes pay for child care while working, attending school, or meeting the WorkFirst participation requirements. Families can apply for WCCC within the same Basic Food application.

Applications for WCCC can be done online at <u>washingtonconnection.org</u> or over the phone at the Washington State Department of Children, Youth, and Families (DCYF) Customer Service Call Center 1-844-626-8687.

WCCC allows parents to choose childcare from:

- Licensed or certified child care centers.
- Licensed or certified family child care homes.
- Relatives who provide care in their own homes.
- Adults who come to the family's home to provide care.

Basic Food:

Local Benefits and Incentive Programs

The US Department of Agriculture (USDA) Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP), called **Basic Food** in Washington State, helps people with low incomes make ends meet by providing monthly benefits to buy food. Individuals and families on Basic Food may also qualify for the following programs that provide additional support and education.

SNAP Market Match



At more than 100 participating Washington State farmers markets and farm stands, customers who use their Basic Food benefits can stretch their food budget to buy more fresh fruits and vegetables!

Participating locations will match \$25 or more per day if you use your EBT card. This **doubles** what you can purchase at the farmers market or farm stand. The Market Match dollars can be used to purchase fresh fruits, vegetables, herbs, mushrooms, and food producing seeds and plants.

SNAP Produce Match



SNAP Produce Match is a helpful way for people who use Basic Food to buy more fresh fruits and vegetables from their local, participating grocery stores.

Use your EBT card to purchase at least \$10 of fresh or frozen fruits and vegetables with no added salt, sugar, or fat. A \$5 coupon will print on the bottom of your receipt*, which can be used to purchase fruits and vegetables. Please call 360-236-3148 for more information.
